Legislative: Col Smith:

Merry Christmas to all veterans--active duty and military retirees. This has been a dynamic year on the legislative front. MOAA continues to tow the line to ensure our veterans receive the benefits they were promised and that they deserve. Before we look at some of the current legislative actions, a moment of light-hearted news is appropriate: NORAD has been tracking Santa for 70 years as he soars across the globe delivering presents in addition to monitoring and defending North American airspace every day. On December 24th, trackers worldwide can call 1-877-HI-NORAD from 4 a.m. to midnight MST to ask live operators about Santa's location. For children without access to a phone, a new web-based calling option will allow them to contact the NORAD Tracks Santa Operations Center directly through the website. The NORAD Tracks Santa website (www.noradsanta.org) features Santa's North Pole Village, which includes a holiday countdown, games, movie theater, holiday music, web store and more.

Tax Update: Retirees in These States Will See Changes in 2026


VA shifts critical dollars to healthcare

The Department of Veterans Affairs recently announced it has terminated a Biden-Administration mandate to spend \$77 million on electric vehicle charging stations at VA facilities. The money will instead be redirected to critical health care construction projects.

Cola Watch

The September 2025 Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W), released Oct. 24, was 318.139, 3.0% above the FY 2025 baseline of 308.729. This means the average CPI-W for the last three months of the fiscal year (July, August, and September 2024) is 317.265. The federal government shutdown delayed October 2025 figures, which had been scheduled for a November 13 release. There are no plans to release those figures; November 2025 figures are scheduled for a December 18 release.

MOAA STANDS READY TO:

Kindest Greetings to all as we move rapidly through another Holiday Season. May the Blessings of this Season be to you and yours I am like most individuals who get many things through the mail, the internet and stuck in the door. Much of it is of little value so it goes in the round file or perhaps to wrap fish with as Jay Leno used to say.

But there are the birthday cards, notices of an account paid off and newspapers which carry some good news - justice finally coming to a long standing situation, as an example. I recently received the latest copy of Imprints, a publication of Hillsdale College which has as, its feature, a notice of an upcoming event next year which all Americans should observe, namely, the 250th Anniversary of the greatest political document in Our Nation's history, the Declaration of Independence.

My column is taken from the article which highlights its colorful history. The Declaration is some 1350 words long, Its majesty is matched by its pithiness, It contains an entire account of the source, the purpose and the manner of the government of the United States. In these three things is to be found the solution to our problems.

First, the source of our government. "the laws of nature as the laws of God." These things we know by seeing and thinking about the things around us in nature. Under these laws of nature, the Declaration says, "that all men are created equal. "Put any common noun in place of "man" and the formula still works. All men, meaning human beings, are equal in being human which makes them equal in their rights. Everything we know, we know through our perception of nature and our understanding of the Divine.

Next, the purpose of our government: The Declaration describes to what end we are to be governed, namely the protection of our rights, the rights that are written in nature, These are inherited in man himself, instilled by the Creator Himself. What are these rights? To do these things the human being can do by nature, think, work, speak ,learn , worship, and defend. We must do them or be diminished. Finally the Declaration describes the manner in which we are governed: It must be representative in form and be limited. It may only exercise the powers we delegate to it. It must be run through elected representatives, and, the powers of government must be divided, not concentrated. Here in beautiful outline is the basis of our country, the most successful free county in history. Its anniversary is a chance to remember it.

While MOAA is permitted by law to lobby—and does so actively—its status as a tax-exempt veterans organization precludes it from participating in political activities, which are defined as intervening directly or indirectly in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Stated briefly: the association may advocate issues, but it may not advocate the election or defeat of particular candidates or political parties. This newsletter follows the policies of MOAA National.

MOAA Store and ROTC/Junior ROTC Items

The MOAA store has re-opened at https://moaa.estore.shop/. In addition to promotional gear, you can find ROTC and Junior ROTC (JROTC) award certificates (in stock now) and medals (place orders now for backorders to be shipped when medals are in stock, expected by the end of April). Electronic certificates may be customized and downloaded online at any time. Note that medals have been updated to reflect all eight uniformed services, and JROTC certificates have been updated with language more appropriate to high school students rather than ROTC students.

The cost of medals to affiliates will remain at \$3.00 per medal due to a MOAA subsidy. Additionally, the store recently added the USPS live rate to shipping options, providing a lower-cost alternative.

Council Meetings

According to the Council By-Laws: There shall be a regular meeting of the Council during each of the first two trimesters of each calendar year. Notice of such meeting, provided by the Secretary, shall be mailed, via post or electronically, to each officer, appointive official of the Council, and each member of the Council at least 30 days before the time appointed for such meeting.
